## **Pioneer Day Parade Guidelines for 2012**

1. A registration form for each float or entry must be submitted by Tuesday, July 17, 2012 by 5:00 pm. The registration form must be completely filled out and approved. This can be done online or in person.

2. The Pioneer Day Committee reserves the right to deny participation to any entry deemed controversial, inappropriate or for any other reason not needing to be specified.

3. All entries desiring to be judged must arrive at the Holt Arena parking lot by 7:45 am. Marching teams, horses, and other entries should arrive prior to 9:00 am. Look for the parade officials to help you find your line up position.

4. Vehicles not intended to pull floats should be kept away from the assembly area in a designated parking area except to unload persons or items necessary to complete the float. Please remove the vehicle promptly after unloading.

5. Those arriving with horses or other animals should pay particular attention to potential problems with waste elimination and behavior. If you have horses (or other animals) in the parade, you must provide someone to clean up the staging area, follow you along and clean up during and along the parade route, as well as in the Pocatello High School Parking Lot. THIS IS A CITY ORDINANCE. You will be fined for non-compliance.

6. The parade will start promptly at 10:00 am.

7. All parade entries that intend to distribute candy or other items must comply with the Following CITY ORDINANCE: No items can be 'thrown'. Candy must be 'handed' to recipients.

8. Entries from all of the faiths are welcome and encouraged to participate, and will be considered in the judging unless requesting to not compete.

9. Non-profit entries are welcome in the parade at no cost if pre-registered. Late registration is \$25.

10. Commercial entries are welcome in the parade for a fee of \$25. Late registration fee is \$50 and due before the parade begins.

11. No vehicles or floats are allowed to have or distribute a political message. No signage, campaign material, or other methods of advertising are permitted.

12. All participants are to continue moving at a steady pace. Performance groups are not allowed to stop and perform lengthy routines that disrupt the flow of the parade.

13. Violations to any of these guidelines may be reason to be removed from this parade as well as not to be permitted to participate in future Pioneer Day Celebration parades.
